
Corinne McVeigh

Rather than focusing on scent-heavy fragrances, she prioritizes skin-loving plants such as calendula, aloe, chickweed, mugwort, oats, and pumpkin. These special ingredients are garden-grown or responsibly foraged whenever possible. Bars of soap are lightly scented but are packed with powerful ingredients that moisturize, protect, and repair.
