2023—Making the Leap from Surviving to Thriving!

Following a resurgence of activity and growth in 2022, RVCC continued its march toward our goal of long-term sustainability and expanded its role as the center of our thriving community this year. Some highlights:

- ◆ An astounding outpouring of support from our membership in completing our greatest Annual Fund and Membership campaign ever, swelling our ranks to over 800 members and raising unrestricted revenues to help recoup shortfalls in fundraising and rental income during the pandemic;
- Another record-smashing year for the Treasure Chest thrift store, led by manager Ricki Shepherd and assistant Kyndal Steele and their phenomenal team of volunteers;
- ◆ The return of an active, post-pandemic class schedule, with the yoga room filling back up, exercise classes in full swing and a host of new classes and events, including the sponsorship of three new "Micro Books & Brews" events celebrating the work of local authors;
- ♦ A hearty "Welcome Aboard" to our new kitchen tenant "Coquito Kitchen", keeping our streak of 100% lease occupancy alive for the ninth straight year;
- ◆ The inauguration of RVCC's amazing new skate park our largest infrastructure project to date – with a highly-successful "SK8 Nelson Festival" that raised enough funds to cover our ever-increasing insurance costs;
- ◆ The purchase of a new electronic sign for the front of the building, which will provide information to the public about our programs, events, tenants and facilities;
- ◆ Our first annual "Summer Sunset" party a season-ending celebration of our devoted and irreplaceable volunteer corps with food, drink, entertainment and heartfelt thanks;
- A new "Rock Hall of Frames" in the West hallway, featuring repurposed window sashes from our "Windows '16" replacement project, and highlighting the many capital projects that have maintained and improved RVCC over the years;
- ◆ A busy and successful year for our Rockfish Gallery & Gifts store, which supports over 40 local artists by displaying and selling their beautiful and creative arts & crafts to our members and quests;
- ◆ Installation of 66 more photovoltaic panels on our East roof to complete our "Rock & Sol Revival" project, boosting our energy production to over 50% of our total consumption, helping to offset recent hikes in electricity prices, and further reducing our carbon footprint on the planet;
- ◆ The triumphant completion of our fundraising effort for "Play it Up!" our playground expansion and improvement project that will double the current playground footprint and add a new kids' play area in the recently-completed skate park in early 2024; and
- ◆ The formation of our new Recreation Committee, composed of both RVCC members and other community stakeholders, which is empowered to plan the evolution of our outdoor athletic and entertainment spaces and to guide their use.



Programs and Fundraising

After a rough start to the decade, 2023 continued RVCC's streak of our "roaring twenties," with unprecedented accomplishments in fundraising, infrastructure improvements, and goals set for the coming years.

The Treasure Chest Thrift Store



The Treasure Chest thrift store has been a source of financial support for RVCC since its opening in 2001. The store performs an essential service for the community: this is a place where people can recycle and find all types of gently used items. When items cannot be sold, most of what is culled from the inventory goes families in need, or to another organization that serves the low-income pop-

ulation of Nelson and elsewhere. 2023 continued the thrift store's record-smashing trends in sales and donations, thanks to the stellar efforts of the staff and volunteers. 2023 also marked the introduction of a monthly 50% Off Sale, held on the first Saturday of each month.

SK8 Nelson



The official grand opening of our new 10,000sf skate park was held on April 23, 2023, and the annual SK8 Nelson Festival was held at the new park on July 22, 2023. Thanks to the phenomenal efforts of the SK8 Nelson Committee, RVCC raised enough funding to cover not only the 2023 insurance premi-

um, but also a sizeable portion of the 2024 costs!

Play It Up!



2023 also marked the completion of fundraising for a significant upgrade and expansion to our playground. Guided by input from community members, our playground planning committee, industry professionals and the design expertise of LPDA's Jessica Mauzy, we launched our "Play It Up!" fundraising cam-

paign early this year. By the spring of 2024, we will have completed the construction of an expanded, more accessible play area based around the existing playground, and will soon add a new play area next to the new skate park.

Events, Parties, and Fun!



2023 brought a significant increase in the use of our facility for festivals, weddings, quinceaneras, baby and bridal showers, birthday parties, and more! We also saw an increase in the number of people using our recreational facili-



ties: kids playing soccer, kickball and softball; families riding scooters or bikes, and skating along the new paved path; folks bringing their dogs out for playdates, and frequent pickleball

players on the basketball court.

Rockfish Gallery & Gifts



In 2014, Kathy Bonham opened the Rockfish River Gallery at RVCC in order to continue the 22-year legacy begun by the Valley Green Gallery in Nellysford. Under Kathy's stewardship, the gallery show-cased and supported hundreds of Virginia-based artists. By the time Kathy retired in 2022, the gallery had become a crucial means of

support for local artisans. One of the pillars of RVCC's mission is to meet the cultural needs of our community, so we undertook saving the gallery from closing because of our fervent desire to support the terrific artists and artisans who show & sell their work here – and to further our core mission of meeting the cultural needs and desires of our membership and our larger community.

Adopting the newly-named Rockfish Gallery & Gifts as an arts program at RVCC quickly became one of the most challenging and rewarding projects we've ever undertaken.

A phenomenal team of volunteers stepped up to the task and transformed the gallery into something truly magical. Under their guidance, the Gallery's first full year produced levels of sales and artist engagement that far exceeded our initial expectations. Our hope is to eventually reach a point where the Gallery, like the Treasure Chest, can become self-sustaining.

Huge thanks—and our deepest gratitude—go out to Linda Williams, Jean Shipman, Kat Cummings, Mae Stoll, Hazel Heeren, Virginia Dawnswir, Cynthia McGrath, Laurie Noto-Estep, Corinne McVeigh, Sharon Nugent, and all the supporting volunteers and artists for their vision, passion, enthusiasm and countless hours of labor that make Rockfish Gallery & Gifts such a gorgeous and inspirational place here at RVCC.







Mallory Creek Wildflower Garden



In early 2023, the Master Gardeners of Nelson County broke ground on a smaller, more manageable version of the original Mallory Creek Wildflower Meadow. The big meadow was spectacular for the first couple of years, but quickly became too large a project for either the Master Gardener volunteers or RVCC's volunteers to maintain.



The new garden is located alongside the new paved walkway on our grounds, near the Nectarshare beehive. The garden will provide much-needed food for the bees, and will include a lovely selection of native plants and flowers.

The site preparation has been completed, and we look forward to planting in early 2024.
